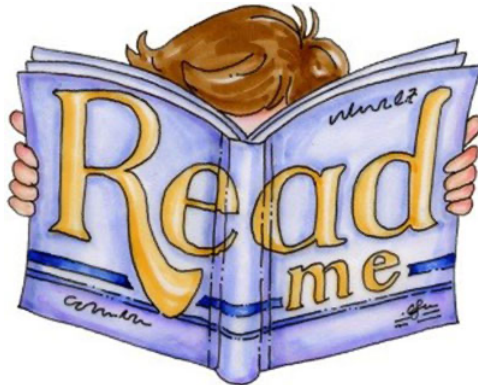


## IF FIRST YOU DON'T SUCCEED, READ THE INSTRUCTIONS!
