Faithful Joseph. When Joseph awoke from his dream, he proved himself faithful too... but in a different way!

And Joseph awoke from his sleep and did as the angel of the Lord commanded him, and took Mary as his wife, but kept her a virgin until she gave birth to a Son; and he called His name Jesus. (NASB) Matt. 1:24-25
